Question: What do I do if a Sepsis Alert fires and the patient has already been discharged?

Answer: Review the laboratory tests and temperatures and evaluate why the alert fired. Notify the doctor.

If a patient comes in with diagnosis of MRSA, TB, Meningitis, or any communicable disease, place them on appropriate isolation and place an order in Cerner for the appropriate isolation. Follow Isolation guidelines on the Intranet.
